


Troodos Mountains & Nicosia


Join us for one of our most popular trips and discover traditional Cyprus, the unspoiled beauty of Troodos Mountains and Nicosia town - the last divided city in the world!


First we drive to Nicosia, the capital of the island, where free time will be given to stroll around the Walled Old Town Center, relax with a coffee or walk up to the barrier (also known as the "Green Line") that divides Nicosia into two since the Turkish invasion, in 1974.

As we drive towards Troodos Mountains we stop at Kakopetria, a well-preserved village with traditional picturesque houses. In Kakopetria you will get the chance to walk around the quaint little village known for its running waters and mini waterfall and mingle with the friendly locals. We continue towards the peak of Troodos Mountains, where the forest stretches as far as the eye can see. We stop at Troodos Square, the highest point of Troodos Mountains, where free time will be given for lunch (optional extra). Situated right in the heart of the island, this location offers some of the most breathtaking views in Cyprus.

Following lunch you will experience one of the highlights of this excursion, the beautiful traditional village of Omodos. The village is built around the Holy Cross monastery, one of the oldest and most sacred monasteries in the island. Omodos is a famous wine producing village with lots of small shops where you can taste and buy some of the best local Cypriot handmade products and wine.

 Visitors must dress appropriately when visiting religious places. No tank tops or shorts allowed for men or women!





A trip that gives you the chance to visit the beautiful coastal town of Famagusta and to go as near as possible to the fenced and sealed-off part of the town that is known all around the world as the 'Ghost Town of Varosha'! The first stop is the Monastery of Saint Barnabas, the founder of the Cypriot Orthodox Church. There you will also have the chance to visit the Icon Museum of the Monastery as well as the tomb of Saint Barnabas who martyred in the area in 52AD. Our trip continues with a visit to the ancient city-kingdom of Salamis, founded right after the Trojan War by the archer Teucer who came from the Greek island of Salamis. Time will be given there for a guided tour around the archaeological site which includes a beautiful ancient Greek theater and marble columns, Roman Baths and a Gymnasium.




We then drive back to Famagusta Old Town Center, where free time will be given for lunch (optional extra) and sightseeing. During your free time there, we highly recommend a walk around the Venetian Walls that surround the old part of the town and a visit at the Gothic Church of Saint Nicolas and Othello Castle (optional extra) which is mentioned by William Shakespeare in his play "Othello".

Your last stop will be the beach located right next to the 'Ghost Town of Varosha'. There, you will have the chance to swim in the crystal clear blue waters of the beautiful golden sand beach of Famagusta, whilst taking in the eerie sight of the abandoned buildings which have been desolate since the Turkish invasion in 1974. On our way back we drive right next to the "Ghost Town of Varosha", where you can see exactly how the area, that was once the best tourist resort of the island, now looks like!

NOTES:

- Clients that do not wish to visit Saint Barnabas and Salamis can have extra free time in Famagusta Old Town Center.
- Double entry ticket to Salamis & Saint Barnabas is an optional extra payable on the day
 of the excursion.
- Passports or European Union ID Cards are needed on the day of the excursion.
- For this excursion, clients staying in Larnaca area are transferred to and back from the excursion bus in Ayia Napa with mini bus or local bus service.

A unique day out that gives you the chance to explore timeless traditional villages, to enjoy breathless scenic views of Troodos Mountains and to explore the two largest and most diverse towns of the island!

First we drive to **Nicosia**, the capital of the island, where free time will be given to stroll around the **Walled Old Town Center**, relax with a coffee or walk up to the barrier (also known as the "Green Line") that divides Nicosia into two since the Turkish invasion, in 1974.


Continuing our journey towards Troodos Mountains, we stop at Virgin Mary of Assinou Church (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) with amazing frescoes that will take your breath away with their beauty. Our next stop is Troodos Mountains Square, where free time will be given for lunch (optional extra). Situated right in the green heart of the island, this location offers some of the most breathtaking mountain views in Cyprus.

We then visit the picturesque Lania village, one of the famous Commandaria wine producing villages. Commandaria is one of the oldest wines in the world and it has been produced in Cyprus for more than 4000 years. Homer mentions this sweet tasting wine in his ancient Greek texts!

The return journey will take you through Limassol, the second largest town of the island, where you will have free time to relax in the surroundings of this beautiful coastal town.

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

During your free time there, you have the chance to cross the barrier (also known as the "Green Line") that divides the Cypriot capital of Nicosia into the southern Greek Cypriot region and the northern Turkish Cypriot region since the Turkish invasion in 1974. So please do not forget to take your passports with you if you want to visit both sides of the last divided city in the world!
